Studies confirm that 'parents and families have the greatest influence on students' careerrelated decisions at the senior secondary level. They must be engaged, fully informed and supported in the advice they provide to their children.' (Shergold Review, pg. 17)

In light of this, we are excited to extend an invitation for you to attend the upcoming Cardijn College Careers and Pathways Expo.

A significant community event, the Careers and Pathways Expo is an opportunity for students and families to access the most current information from expert providers to help shape informed decisions for the future.

Whether a student is transitioning to the senior years of education, considering a campus transfer, or preparing to transition into life beyond Cardijn, this event will provide an opportunity to engage with specialists in industry, education and training.

Early next term:

• Students in Years 9-11 will be required to make subject selections which may ultimately shape their future pathway. Starting with the 'end in mind', is often helpful in making wise subject choices as students consider their strengths and interests in addition to pre-requisite subjects. Incorporating a VET course into their study program may also be a consideration. In the graduating class of 2022, over 50% of students graduated with dual certification, their SACE and a VET Certificate. This event provides the only opportunity where all providers of VET Certificates will be present for parents/caregivers and students to discover more about specific programs.

• The class of 2023 will begin the SATAC process, where they will be required to lodge their preferences for further study. Gaining information from tertiary providers will be a crucial element in this process. If work or training is the preferred pathway, then having access to industry representatives, training providers and group training organisations will be crucial in ensuring the 'first steps' beyond Cardijn are considered, well planned and informed. This event will cater for all these options.

NDIS providers will also be in attendance, providing information and guidance regarding the services they provide and how these services can be incorporated into pathway planning for NDIS recipients.

Inspiring the best

This year we have 2 key presentations which you are warmly invited to attend. At 3:00pm, The University of Adelaide will present 'Jobs of the Future' where you can hear about emerging technologies and industries, as well as the skills that will be needed to thrive in an ever-changing workforce. At 4:00pm, specialist post-school service providers will present to interested students and families who can access the NDIS, allowing connections to be made for future pathway supports. Both presentations will occur in the Music Performance Suite, adjacent to the Gym.

We are most excited about this event and the key role it can play in helping students gain a better understanding of what is possible and how it can be achieved.

Frequently Asked Questions Careers and Pathways Expo

• How does the 'Careers and Pathways Expo' work?
