Marcellin and Marian students celebrated International Women's Day (IWD) at the annual Adelaide IWD Breakfast hosted by Senator Penny Wong.


This year's theme was Count Her In: Invest in Women. Accelerate Progress.

Galilee Year 8 students explore Tjilbruke

The Year 8 students who are part of the Exploring Tjilbruke program recently visited Pt Willunga/Wirruwarungga (Kaurna language) to explore part of the Tjilbruke Trail.

They discovered a freshwater spring and compared its salinity levels to those of the spring at Kingston Park/Tulukutangga. They found that the Pt Willunga/Wirruwarungga spring had slightly lower salt levels.

During the excursion, the students had the opportunity to hear reflections from Miriam Rose Ungunmerr Baumann, the first qualified Aboriginal educator in the Northern Territory. She founded the Miriam Rose Foundation, which supports Indigenous children and youth.

Afterwards, the students worked in small groups to create beautiful sand mandalas.

We asked the students to give their feedback on the excursion. Here are some of their words:

Skye - 'It was such a calm day.'

Noah - 'I enjoyed creating the beach mandalas.'

Lachlan - 'The water was less salty and much cleaner at the Pt Willunga spring.'

Lukah - 'I loved finding crabs, it showed there is life.'





Cardijn hosts an inspiring 'Our Church' gathering for the Southern Community



You can support your child by reassuring them that NAPLAN is a part of their school program and reminding them that their effort matters more than their score.


Year 7 2026 applications are closing soon!

Reviewing and Feedback

As mentioned earlier in Cardijn Connect, I was privileged to be invited to present some insights into my faith formation, from both a personal and professional perspective. I do this in the context and foundations of my rich family life and upbringing.
